The CfP was discussed within the committee and the final form established.

The Call for Panels was published in October, and the Call for Individual Papers was published in December, via the ISCH's newsletter, website, social media, and the CULTHIST mailing list and some other mailing lists, with reminders near the deadlines.

During the year, the committee received several proposals of potential venues for the future ISCH conferences.

The committee and the conference organizers agreed that the following conferences will be organized in Paris (2026), in Mexico City (2027) and in Utrecht (2028).

ISCH Prize 2024


The ISCH Prize competition for the best conference presentation by an early career scholar was announced at the annual ISCH conference in Potsdam.

The number of submissions, 18, was higher than ever.

The ISCH prize committee was composed by Alessandro Arcangeli, Josephine Hoegaerts and Jasmin Lukkari.

The ISCH Prize winner in 2024 was Maximilian Tarik Orliczek, from the University of Graz, Austria, with his presentation titled 'Archaeokinetics: Research-Historical, Theoretical, and Methodological Considerations on Reconstructing Ancient Athletics'.
